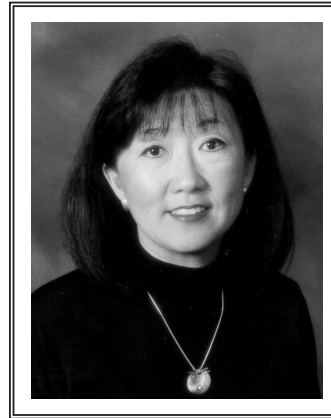

Angela E. Oh is an attorney, teacher, and public lecturer. Her teaching appointments have been at UCLA School of Law, UCLA Asian American Studies Department, and UC Irvine School of Social Sciences and Political Science.

Over the past 19 years, she has worked as a trial attorney. She was a partner at Beck, DeCorso, Barrera & Oh for seven years where her practice was primarily criminal defense. Later, she founded Oh and Barrera, LLP, a four woman firm that provided both civil and criminal representation. Oh has been able to create a practice that allows her to draw upon her professional and political experiences. Her current portfolio includes a project on gang-violence prevention strategies for the California State Attorney General's office, consent decree monitor for the Equal

Employment Opportunity Commission, trainer on race and gender discrimination for public, private and non-profit organizations, and program consultant on religion and politics for two national leadership development organizations.

In June 1997, she was appointed by President William Jefferson Clinton to the President's Initiative on Race. She was part of a seven-member Advisory Board to the President in an effort directed at creating a national dialogue and examination of race relations in the United States.

Oh has previously served on select commissions and boards such as the California Commission on Access to Justice, the Los Angeles City Commission on Human Relations, and the 9th Circuit Judicial Conference. Her current activities include serving on the boards of Women's Policy, Inc., the CORO Leadership Foundation of Southern California, and the Western Justice Center Foundation. She is also a member of the Board of Directors for Lawyers Mutual Insurance Company and a Commissioner on the ABA Commission on Women in the Legal Profession.

Oh's public lectures and writings reflect the opportunities and challenges that diversity presents. Her lectures have taken her into both national and international arenas, including China, Korea, the Middle East, Northern Ireland and the United Kingdom.

She is a graduate of University of California Los Angeles, where she earned her Bachelor of Arts degree and Masters Degree in Public Health. Her Juris Doctorate is from King Hall, the University of California, Davis School of Law. In 1996, she was awarded the Distinguished Alumni Award from King Hall, and in 2003 she awarded Distinguished Alumni for Community Service by UCLA. In 2004, Oh was named to the Hall of Fame at the UCLA School of Public Health. She is also an ordained Priest, Zen Buddhist-Rinzai Sect.
