Gerald Early is the Director of the Department of African and Afro-American Studies and Professor of English and African and Afro-American Studies at Washington University in St. Louis. He has edited a collection of Countee Cullen's work as well as *Speech and Power*, an anthology of African-American Essays, and *Lure & Loathing: Essays on Race, Identity, and the Ambivalence of Assimilation*. He is the author of *Tuxedo Junction*, a collection of essays on American culture, and *Daughters: On Family and Fatherhood*. His latest book, *The Culture of Bruising: Essays on Prize Fighting*, won the 1994 National Book Critics award. He is the recipient of a Whiting Writer's Award and a General Electric Foundation Award. Forthcoming is a book on Motown Records called *One Nation Under A Groove: Motown and American Culture*, to be published in June 1995, by Ecco Press. He currently is finishing a book about Fisk University.
